002/24		<b>Apologies for Absence</b> – Apologies were received from the Clerk, Nadine Phibbs. The apologies were accepted.					
003/24	Declara	<b>ations of Interest</b> – There were no d	eclarations of interest.				
004/24	Matters of Urgency - Not on the Agenda CM/3/24/DOC, Approval of details reserved by condition imposed under CM/24/23/PI relating to conditions 7-surface water drainage and 8-discharge of flows. Bramleys Horsemere Green Lane Climping CM/4/24/A, Various illuminated and non illuminated advertisements on various locations. The Oystercatcher Yapton Road Climping BN17 5RU The above two applications will be considered under agenda item 11, Planning, together with concerns over excessive lighting at the Dementia Home on A259.						
005/24	<b>Public Opportunity</b> School Lane – Council was advised that the school Governors have spoken to local MP, WSCC, ADC and the Landowner in relation to the poor state of School Lane but it appears that no one will take responsibility. The school feels that they cannot undertake the work themselves due to cost and that they may become liable for any further works. This matter will be discussed further under agenda item 12,3, Transport Working Group.						
006/24	<b>Minutes</b> – Minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on the 14 <sup>th</sup> November 2023 were confirmed and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

008/24	Vacancies for Councillors - The Chairman advised the Council that there are currently two vacancies for Councillors open for co-option and we have received one application. The Chairman welcomed Jane Mules (the applicant) to the meeting and asked her to make a short presentation about herself, her interest in the Parish Council and her reasons for wishing to become a Councillor. Following the presentation, Councillors were given the opportunity to ask any questions to the applicant. The result of the vote <b>RESOLVED</b> to co-opt Jane Mules to serve as a Councillor until the next ordinary election. Jane Mules read out her Declaration of Acceptance of Office and signed the declaration form along with the dispensation form for any matter relating to setting the precept. The Clerk will send the newly co-opted Councillor further documentation to complete and return within 28 days, including Code of Conduct and Register of Interest.

application. At that time the Parish Council had no objections, but it did raise concerns about the size and nature of the proposals and relationship with the adjoining cottage, and tha the black timber cladding would appear to be intrusive.							
In addition, the discovery of a bat roost, the Parish Council seeks clarification of t bat impacts before the application is considered. – (it was noted that application I been withdrawn)							
CM/45/23/PL Observations to be received by 14 <sup>th</sup> January 2024 Demolition of existing garage and erection of 1 No. two storey dwelling (resubmission of CM/29/23/PL). This application is a Departure from the Development plan, may affect the setting of a Listed Building, is in CIL Zone 5 and CIL Liable as new dwelling. 3 Kents Cottages Brookpit Lane Climping - No Objection, but to make below comment Clymping Parish Council notes that this is a new dwelling within the Littlehampton to Middleton gap and therefore would set a precedent within the gap which Local Plan Policy should only be approved if there is no alternative location outside the gap.
