108/25	Public Opportunity – A resident representing the Save the Beach Campaign suggested that ADC have breached the terms of the 'Tenants' Lease they hold with Crown Estates and failed to repair or maintain the wooden groynes. The resident asked whether the Parish Council had reviewed the lease and whether it intends to apply further pressure on ADC to fulfil their responsibilities regarding the maintenance of Climping Beach. Councillor Colin Humphris responded that the Parish Council has actively engaged with ADC, facilitating several meetings involving ADC, the Environment Agency (EA), and the local community. With regarding the upcoming community meeting on 1st December, District Councillor Amanda Worne had informed the Parish Council that, despite discussions with a senior officer at Arun District Council (ADC), no representative from ADC will be available to attend the meeting. On the subject of Climping Beach, another resident suggested that the Parish Council could attempt to facilitate a land and homeowners meeting. Two representatives from Middleton-on-Sea Parish Council attended this evening's meeting to report that a Community Garden has been established at the Hobbs allotment site. It was noted that the current allotment lease is due to expire in 2036, and Middleton-on-Sea Parish Council is currently seeking to meet with the landowner to discuss future options. A resident raised the concern regarding the removal of trees are the Foreman Home site.

- c. Planning Working Group -
- 1. **Foreman Homes Development -** Foreman Homes proposals for 300 homes remain to be finalised. A major issue is the lack of approved plans for surface water drainage and for the removal of sewage. ADC discharged Condition 10 iii within CM/23/25/DOC. In relation to the Archaeology survey, Wessex Archaeology have agreed to provide a presentation. It was noted that a representative from Foreman Homes is now engaging with the Parishes.

Members agreed to try again to set up regular liaison with Foreman Homes for the PC as works are continuing and concerns being expressed by residents.

2. **Ford Airfield Development** – Councillors Colin Humphris & Tim Hibbert attended the regular briefing with Vistry. County Councillor Jacky Pendleton and District Councillor Amanda Worne were also present.

Vistry appear to have resolved their drainage monitoring issues in support of their drainage proposals. This is in part due to a Supreme Court ruling that means ADC shouldn't block a Reserved Matters application because a condition of an approved Outline application has yet to be discharged. It all sounded a bit technical, but it means the three Reserved Matters applications for the 1500 homes Ford site can now go forward on Planning Committee meeting December 17th.

Vistry were pressed on the ongoing closure of footpath 175 and the failure to open the WSCC approved alternative route. In the past we had been led to believe this was dependant on the approval of the Construction Management Plan. This has been approved and footpaths across the north of the site reopened. Under pressure they agreed to are check if there is technical reason for this and we should hear soon.

An undertaking was also secured from them to check the capacity available at the Southern Water treatment plant given the extensive development underway or planned in Yapton, Ford and Clymping.

- 3. **Rampion 2** The Development & Stakeholder Manager, Rampion 2 has advised that we will receive the promised briefing next week and will seek to arrange the agreed on-site meeting in Spring 2026
- 4. Ford, Yapton and Clymping Advisory Group No Meeting held

- Transport Working Group Meeting to discuss potential highways options with the WSCC Area Highway Manager has still to be organised. County Councillor Jacky Pendleton will follow this matter up.
- Department of Transport Council noted the Department of Transport Proposed stopping up at Bread Lane & Climping Street.
- 3. **Entrance to the Church -** At the previous Full Council meeting on 23rd September, <u>a</u> resident raised the issue the Church Road Junction with Church Lane (road markings/signage) and that concerns have been raised that when approaching to turn into the Church Hall off Church Lane, the turning from the south at night, you cannot see the entrance. This is exacerbated when facing the headlights of oncoming traffic. It was noted that the Parish Council had agreed to purchase appropriate signage that can highlight the entrance to the lane leading to the church and hall at a previous meeting. It was agreed that the Clerk will determine the correct standard of signage and email the WSCC Area Highway Manager and Assistant Area Highways Manager (cc'ing County Councillor Jacky Pendleton) to seek permission to erect the signage on the green at the entrance to the church.
